

TAPA FSR

International Standard for cargo companies and storage security



As a manufacturer of highly valuable products at risk of theft, cross-border cargo crime is one of the greatest challenges within your supply chain. To counter the increasing security threats, the international Transport Asset Protection Association (TAPA*) initiated development of standards for greater transparency and security in the carry and logistics sector. The globally accepted standard TAPA FSR specifies minimum requirements for secure, protected storage and intermediate warehousing of items of property.



FSR – Facility Security Requirements



Using the TAPA FSR security standard, you identify and evaluate possible risks within your entire storage. This risk evaluation creates transparency and permits the proactive implementation of appropriate and effective control measures.

Facility Security Requirements are applicable

- At all locations that are part of the global supply chain, depending on need, risk and requirements of a buyer or logistics services provider, everywhere.
- On premises owned or operated by the logistics services provider.
- On premises owned or operated by the buyer.

The relevant audits can be carried out at any locations of the international supply chain.

- Improvement of protection for high-value goods at risk of theft
- Implementation of security measures using a systematic, risk-based approach
- Competitive advantages and improved image due to transparency and building customers' trust




DQS Auditors

DQS is authorised by TAPA (Transport Asset Protection Association) to certify in accordance with FSR freight security requirements. Certification is available in security levels A, B and C. During the certification audit, all areas relevant to security will be evaluated according to a checklist specially developed by TAPA: e. g. camera and security systems, access controls as well as security for storage areas and the company site itself. If all applicable requirements have been met, DQS will issue a certificate valid for three years. After the certificate has been issued, the company is required to carry out annual self-evaluations until re-certification during the third year. TAPA may request reports of the results of these self-evaluations.
